

Capital Campaign Update





With having such a large and historic building, it does come with its challenges to keep updated to ensure that it continues in its mission for generations to come. As many of you may have heard, First United Methodist Church is in the very early stages of a Capital Campaign. The needed updates are part of the Missional Priorities that many of you were a part of in 2021 and hopefully you read the communication that was recently distributed. Specifically:

- MISSIONAL PRIORITY 3 Improve Technology and Digital Outreach
- MISSIONAL PRIORITY 4 Church Building Renovations are the driving factors for this potential capital campaign.

The main areas that need improvement based on comments received over the course of the last several years include improvement to the overall sound, lighting, elevation changes as well as some areas that are simply worn out. The additional resounding comment has been to make sure that we do not alter the historical integrity of the church.

A Steering Committee was formed in September of 2022 to begin the exploration of a Capital Campaign along with a couple of sub-committees. One of these sub-committees (Design and Construction Committee) met multiple times to go through the church in detail. While there are potentially many areas through the building, the specific potential areas of work include:

Building Exterior

You have all probably noticed some water damage to walls and ceilings throughout the church and especially near the choir loft in the sanctuary. The root of this is the exterior of the building needs to have some significant repairs to the brickwork or tuckpointing. This most likely has to be completed before we can make the repairs and updates on the inside of the church.

Sanctuary

- 1) Reconfigure the platform and altar area to provide move overall space that can been seen from all areas of the sanctuary.
- 2) Updating the audio and acoustical throughout the sanctuary, including removing the many black speakers.
- 3) Updating the video service.
- 4) Replace the existing rail in the balcony and update for safety.
- 5) Improvements in the overall HVAC including humidification for the organ.
- 6) Provide protective covers for stained glass that will also help with regulating temperature.
- 7) Repairs to pews.
- 8) Updates to overall lighting.

Stairwells and Hallways

- 1) Replace and update lighting.
- 2) Remove and replace old wall tile and flooring in stairwells.
- 3) Update with new paint.

Choir Room

- 1) Replace the current HVAC system to provide better temp control.
- 2) Replace and update lighting.
- 3) Paint areas as needed.

This is certainly not an all-encompassing list of work that needs to be completed or will be completed -but is a high level overview. Also, our ability to complete all of this work will depend on the estimated costs of construction and success in the capital campaign.

As mentioned previously, we are in the early stages of a possible capital campaign. We have hired a company called Maximizing Excellence to help us with a feasibility study on this project, who also helped us with our last capital campaign back in 2017.

Some of you have asked about using the large gifts that our congregation received over the last few years for the construction costs. We have secured a commitment from the Foundation and Church Council to enable us to use §640,000 of funds the church has in savings. But, we will need to raise significantly more to complete the work we are contemplating.

While we do not have any firm costs on the possible projects or the timing of when some of these projects will begin, we will have a couple members of our Steering Committee and Design and Construction Committee available to answer any questions and receive feedback in the MPR between services on Sunday, April 2, 2023.

Missional Priorities Update

It is such an exciting time to be in worship, mission and ministry together at First Church.

We have entered our second full year of working on our Missional Priorities and we wanted to give you an update on our progress!

The Missional Priorities are intended to help guide us as we go about the work of making disciples of Jesus Christ and to focus our efforts on areas that the people of our church felt were the most important as we serve our community, our neighborhood and our congregation. We thank you all for your commitment to the ministry of the Church!

Phase 1 (2022 -2023)

MISSIONAL PRIORITY 1 — Launch a new worship service connecting with persons under the age of 50.

STATUS UPDATE We successfully launched the 11:01 service in April 2022, and have continued to reach and engage new people through the service!

MISSIONAL PRIORITY 2 — Develop children and youth ministries by growing participation by 5-10% each year.

STATUS UPDATE As of March 6, 2023, we have hired LuAnn Berkhof to serve as a new full-time Director of Children's Ministry at First Church!

MISSIONAL PRIORITY 3 — Improve Technology and Digital Outreach: Acquire and implement new technologies to enhance the connections with our current congregation and potential new members.

STATUS UPDATE ➤ The capital campaign that is currently being explored will address video and audio improvements. We will begin considering social media connections in more detail later in 2023.

MISSIONAL PRIORITY 4 — Church Building Renovations: Renovate the Sanctuary and certain other areas of the church to allow us to continue our ministry.

STATUS UPDATE We have formed a capital campaign team and have spent several months evaluating the potential work to be done and the feasibility of a capital campaign at this time. The feasibility process is well underway, and in June we anticipate making a decision about whether to move forward with the campaign.

Phase 2 (2024-2025)

THE PHASE 2 MISSIONAL PRIORITIES INCLUDE

- Welcoming and connecting 150 New Members into the life of the church by 2027.
- Increasing Congregational Volunteerism by 5-10% each year.
- Developing a Leadership Pathway to build up new and existing leaders within the congregation.

STATUS UPDATE ➤ Certain Phase 2 work is already underway, especially as concerns the New Members and Volunteerism Priorities, but these will receive additional focus in 2024–2025.

Phase 3 (2026-2027)

THE PHASE 3 MISSIONAL PRIORITIES INCLUDE

- Creating more opportunities for congregational involvement in Worship and Music.
- Increasing participation in Adult Small Group ministry by 5-10% each year.
- Cultivate a Mission-With Mindset for each of our mission projects.

STATUS UPDATE Work in the Small Group Priority has already begun.

We are excited about the great success we are experiencing with our Missional Priorities and look forward to continuing to work to achieve these goals. We are so blessed to have a congregation that is filled with God's Holy Spirit and engages in finding new ways to be a sanctuary of Christian hope, love and encouragement in the heart of Sioux Falls!
