There is a concept that I was introduced to a few years ago. It is called "star words." It is a tradition/spiritual practice that in some churches usually takes place on Epiphany Sunday where everyone receives a gift of a "star word." As the magi followed the star to Bethlehem to meet Jesus, so we follow this star word throughout the year to grow closer to God. We ponder and pray, as we put the star word in a location where we will see it every day. For 2021 my star word was "difference." Upon receiving this word last January, I honestly had no idea what that would look like. I most certainly had no inclination that by the end of the year I would be living in Sioux Falls and serving here as your associate pastor. Ultimately, I came to see that "difference" was God's way of calling me to something new and to join with others who are making a difference here.

Although I will receive a new personal star word this year, I began to think about our 2022 theme as a church, which will be "Love the 605." Love is a very common principle to strive to live out as Christians. Moreover, it is part of our vision as a congregation to be a sanctuary of Christian hope, love, and encouragement. How does this look different in a new year though? Many things are changing in our community and in our world. Sioux Falls continues to grow exponentially. The world continues to battle a pandemic. Big weather events happen with more frequency. And our nation is bitterly divided politically. Not to mention the everyday tensions of family, school, and work life. Many are still tending to their physical, emotional, and spiritual wounds.

Yet through it all the love of our God remains the same. The love that was born in Jesus. The love that calls for justice for the poor. The love that forgives and heals broken hearts.



The love that welcomes all into the kingdom of God. Love is not just a feeling. It is a gift from our God to go out and do kingdom work with God. Kingdom work reaches out with love to the thousands who are making Sioux Falls home. Kingdom work cares for those who have lost loved ones, offering places where they can come to know God's love even in difficult times. Kingdom work reaches

We do this so that all may know that God loves them and know there is always room at the table for them.

"Mission of the Month" Name Change



Loving the 605 at the Banquet

First United Methodist Church has a wonderful and giving tradition of serving The Banquet. Recently, a generous donation was given to the Church Foundation by an anonymous member of our church. This donation will help the continuation of funding the meals that we serve at The Banquet. If you would like to donate to the Foundation Banquet Fund, please make your check out to: First United Methodist Church Foundation and put Banquet Fund in the memo line.

Here is an update about The Banquet from Gary Healy, **Leader for the Downtown Banquet Crew:**

First Church's connection to the Banquet dates back to the Banquet's 1985 beginning in downtown Sioux Falls. We currently fund, cook, and serve the downtown breakfast the third Tuesday of each month and a Banquet West supper every fourth Tuesday of each month. From February through July 2021, due to the pandemic, the Downtown Banquet asked us to serve twice monthly because they needed volunteers. Our crew rose to the occasion! The Banquet often expresses appreciation for First Church's commitment.

The Downtown Banquet wants 6-8 cooks at 5:30 a.m. to prepare the meal and 18-20 servers at 6:30 a.m. First Church's crew has served with fewer than that because our cooking crew stays to serve and we are experienced. We have been serving with about 14 volunteers, on the edge of insufficient. Our Banquet email list has 96 people. About 24 of those are very active in cooking/serving. We need an increased volunteer pool to ensure our commitment to the Banquet. I am sure that our Westside crew feels the

same need. The Banquet is begging for volunteers, and I dread the day I have to tell them that First Church is unable to find enough cooks/ servers.



Presently we

serve breakfast to about 200 adults and 10 children monthly. That number varies with the time of the month and the weather. A Banquet breakfast sponsorship costs about \$500. A supper costs about \$700, so we contribute about \$1,200 monthly to support the Banquet. For breakfast, the nutritious, varied menus include an entree, sides, fruit, juice, toast, and beverages. Guests enjoy their meal and time shared with friends. Many guests say "thank you" or "God bless you for being here." One first-time guest said, "This is the best meal I have had in a month." One woman asked Sonja Gourley, "Why do you do this?" Ray, a regular guest, has the answer, "Some need to be fed and some need to feed." The Banquet's benefit goes beyond a good meal. Money not spent on food can pay for rent, utilities, child care, and other necessities.

Hunger and poverty are alive and well in Sioux Falls, and I am proud of our church striving to be a sanctuary of Christian hope, love, and encouragement in the heart of Sioux Falls.

Food Distributions with Feeding South Dakota

On the 1st Wednesday of each month at 5:30 p.m., we hold a Food Giveaway in partnership with Feeding South Dakota in our church parking lot. They bring enough food boxes to serve approximately 300 families in our neighborhood. With the help of dedicated volunteers, First Church is making a difference in the downtown area of Sioux Falls!

Build with Habitat for Humanity

Habitat for Humanity is a global, nonprofit housing organization operated on Christian principles that seeks to put God's love into action by building homes and hope. The Habitat for Humanity Team from First Church serves on the 2nd Saturday of each month.

Church on the Street Worship Partners

Church on the Street is a faith community serving the un-housed and people struggling with poverty in Sioux Falls. First Church also partners with their Laundry with

Love Ministry by providing quarters for the laundromat, a listening ear and a hot meal when needed.

Serve Supper with Nightwatch

The Nightwatch team serves supper on the 1st Monday of each month at Hayward Elementary School to approximately 100 children and families.

United Childcare and Preschool Volunteers

United Childcare and Preschool offers affordable care to children ages 2-6 years old. Volunteers must pass a background check.

Kidstop Mentors

Kidstop offers free after-school and summer care to lowincome children in our neighborhood.
