

- (5) Extravagant Generosity

Our pathway to discipleship is non-linear; there are multiple avenues whereby disciples are strengthened and continue to be throughout their lives. Disciples do not always begin at the same point. Some enter through worship, some in a small group, and some with a mission project, in service to others. Each area is vital to participate so that we grow holistically as disciples.

Gathering** disciples seek purpose and belonging through passionate worship of the living God and growing in their hospitality toward others. **Growing** disciples intentionally develop their faith throughout their life within the community of faith in fellowship and small study groups. **Going** disciples strive to give extravagantly out of their resources

and take risks in their mission and service with and for others. Through becoming a gathering, growing, and going disciple, one grows in their ability to love God and love neighbor as themselves. Through various opportunities at First Church, we can Gather, Grow, and Go!

Ultimately, Jesus **GATHERED** people together so they could find purpose, belonging, and community. Jesus, through teaching and discussion, helped people **GROW** in their faith in God and in their calling as children of the living God. ### **Reading Bridge to Provide Summer Tutoring in the Leopard Library**

For 21 years, Reading Bridge has offered summer tutoring to children who have completed Kindergarten - 5<sup>th</sup> grade. The mission of the program is to minimize the "summer gap" that children can sometimes experience over the summer months.

Between July 11-August 4, students have the opportunity to participate in this program at First Church. Trained tutors meet with their small groups for 1 hour a day, 2 times a week over the 4 week period. This will give each child a total of 8 hours of FREE small group tutoring. Research shows that this makes a difference! Time for reading, writing, spelling, and choosing library books (to take home to read) make up the 1 hour time frame. Our tutors make this hour easy and fun for the students!

Reading Bridge is also hosted by 6 other local Siouxland Libraries. For more information visit ReadingBridge. org. There are still open spots at First Church only.
