

KidStop provides after-school care and summer programming for 80+ kids in our community right in our church building. We are grateful to be a part of this thriving ministry.

### You can support KidStop several ways this September:

- First, you can give financially toward KidStop. Part of those donations will end up going toward a closet that KidStop has that provides kids items they need throughout the year, such as shoes, coats, mittens, and school supplies.
- Second, you can donate canned goods (black beans, refried beans, and vegetables) as well as breakfast cereals that will go into the mini-food pantry that KidStop has. Food insecurity is a problem here in Sioux Falls, and it is no different for some of our KidStop families. Drop them off at the church.
- Third, on Sunday, September 11, it is Second Service Sunday at the 11:01, and we will have a mission project that will help our KidStop kids with some necessary items.




# **Fall Grief Group**

# St. Michael's Ethiopian Christian Church Update

On March 26, 2022, First United Methodist opened its doors to the St. Michael's Ethiopian Orthodox congregation. St. Michael's needed a temporary church home after a devastating fire destroyed their church building. Since their first Sunday with us, St. Michael's congregation has worshipped every Sunday, deepened their faith through Holy Week and Easter services, celebrated a wedding and hosted a large celebration on the Sunday of their patron saint, St. Michael.

First Church has received hundreds of 'thank yous' from St. Michael's congregation members, as well as multiple public statements of thankfulness including in the Argus Leader and other media outlets, a regional Ethiopian magazine and at a fundraiser held in July. They greatly appreciate that they have felt welcomed in our church building and have been able to continue to worship and be in community together.

St. Michael's has been working diligently on determining their future. Since the fire, they have learned that they will not be able to re-build their old building as they would be required to build a building based on current building codes, and they just don't have the land to fit both a building and a parking lot. They have also done a substantial amount of fundraising, settled insurance claims on the old building, found new banking relationships and have searched for possible buildings to rent or buy. They have negotiated for the purchase of a building in northwest Sioux Falls and the offer was accepted this week!! They are now working through due

diligence on the building and trying to finalize financing. If they are able to acquire this building, they will likely continue to worship at First Church for three more months. If this purchase falls through for any reason, then it will be longer.

We initially set the termination date of the Building Use Agreement at August 28, 2022. We knew at the time that we may need to extend the term, but wanted to encourage St. Michael's to be diligent in looking for a permanent home. The Church Council has extended the term of the agreement to January 31, 2023 (we don't want a termination date during the holidays).

As with any relationship, our time with St. Michael's has had a few minor bumps. Mostly that their congregation continues to grow and sometimes spills into our hallway and that some of their special celebrations create more dancing, drumming and singing than we are used to in our hallways. We have had excellent cooperation in working with St. Michael's so that we all live in harmony. They have been great guests and are very willing to work with us. And, we are grateful for our congregation's willingness to accept the periodic busy hallways and appreciate that St. Michael's has Christian traditions that are different than ours.

It has been a blessing to "Love the 605" in such an important and meaningful way. First United Methodist is truly living into our commitment to show Christ's love in our community.

# **United Women In Faith**

The mission of United Women in Faith (UWF) is to connect and nurture women to inspire, influence, and impact **local and global communities**. Here at First Church our organization participates in this mission on behalf of women, children, and youth in a variety of ways.

We fund our conference/global/international Pledge to Mission (currently at \$6500) through grocery store gift card sales, and pledges and gifts from our circle members.

Our two primary social events, The Christmas Tea and The Spring Fling, raise funds for a local organization of our choosing. This past year The Christmas Tea raised \$910.30 for Church on the Street, and The Spring Fling raised \$955.25 for Family Visitation Center.

In addition, our local mission giving this past year included \$260 each to United Childcare and Preschool and KidStop, \$100 each to First Church Youth and The Teddy Bear Den, \$250 to The Banquet, and \$110 to the Ministers Discretionary Fund.

We also help support local hands-on projects such as freezer meals, funerals, Shoebox Christmas, and other projects as they arise.

All women at First Church are automatically members of United Women in Faith. Every UWF activity you participate in helps support our mission. In addition to our church wide programs you can participate in fellowship and educational activities through one of our local circles (women's small groups), Mission U, the UWF Reading Program, The Response Magazine, and podcasts.
